

LES Couas

In the south area of Champagney, in the hamlet called "sous les Chênes", («Under the oak-trees»), a pleasant tour lets you admire the flora and the hydraulic richness of the region.

Have a look at the red soil from the clay and the deteriorated sandstone of the Permian period.

Alternation of lobed-leaved-trees (beeches, alders, birches and oak-trees) and pine trees. Many ferns and high variety of flowers. At the beginning of the last century, this place was still very cultivated. You can also admire a parade of well-maintained ponds. Given the closeness of the village, it may be the oldest itinerary.

Departure from the street rue des Bruyères, by a pleasant and shady path that makes you discover the valley of the Rahin and the Vosges Saônoises chain.

On the right, take the asphalt path that goes down to the first ponds.

Possibility to go to the "Baisse du Chien" and return (yellow triangles), or to pursue along an impressive series of lakes.

Join a road, that, from the right, takes you back to the departure point
